Drug Arrests at High Point

Sheriff Jimmy Harris states as follows:

Following several complaints from concerned citizens in the County Road 589 area of the High Point Community, Drug Task Force agents began an investigation that culminated in last night's search of the residence of Floyd Junius Bailey. Thursday night (December 3), after receiving consent to search the residence, Task Force Agents and Sheriff's Deputies located 5 methamphetamine labs, commonly known as "one-pot cooks." Also located were multiple syringes, a small amount of methamphetamine, and other items commonly found with the use and manufacture of meth. A .22-caliber pistol firearm was recovered from Bailey's person, as well as another .22-caliber pistol from his vehicle.

In addition to Bailey, 26, of Fort Payne, inside the residence were Jason Lee Loudermilk, 23, of Sylvania, and Haley Michelle Morton, 27, of Henagar. Also in the residence, near the drugs and paraphernalia, was a small child. DHR was contacted and the child was turned over to the next of kin.

All three subjects were charged with Unlawful Manufacturing of Controlled Substance 2nd Degree, Unlawful Possession of Controlled Substance, and Unlawful Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. They remain in jail at this time awaiting setting of bond.
