U.S. Marshal Service Fugitive Task Force Arrest in DeKalb County

Sheriff Jimmy Harris states as follows:

After a good deal of background work by U.S. Marshal Service and the DeKalb County Sheriff's Office, including surveillance, an arrest was made of a man wanted for a sex crime in Georgia. Timothy Clayton Daniel, 42, who had recently relocated to Rainsville from Cumming, Georgia, was arrested at a convenience store in Rainsville after officers saw him driving away from a house that had been under constant surveillance. He was arrested on a warrant from Forsythe County, Georgia for Aggravated Sexual Battery/Child Molestation. The warrant was issued in October of last year. His alleged victim was a female under the age of 16.

Sheriff Harris said, "I am very pleased with how well we have been able to work with this U.S. Marshal Service Task Force. In fact, we have had five officers who have been approved by the Marshal Service to work on this particular task force. We expect other approvals in the near future. We are happy to have our officers able to branch out into this area and to work in cooperation with the Marshal Service."
