Sheriff Jimmy Harris states as follows:

On Saturday, July 25, around nightfall, Deputy Tony Blackwell observed a man riding a bicycle on the highway in the Kilpatrick area. Deputy Blackwell asked the man for identification, and a short time later found that the man had given a false name and was in fact wanted for violating his parole in the State of Wisconsin. The man, identified as Dwain Allen Williams, 45, was released from a Wisconsin prison in February, where he had served time for 3rd Degree Sexual Assault of a 13 year-old female. Since his release, Williams has been traveling around the United States, going as far west as Wisconsin. He came to DeKalb County by way of Atlanta to visit a sister who lives in the Kilpatrick area. While Williams reportedly registered as a sex offender in Wisconsin before his release, he has not registered in any of the places he has visited since that time. He has been in the DeKalb County area for several days.

Williams was charged with Obstruction of Justice-Giving False Identification to Prevent Arrest, and Community Notification-Failure to Register. He remains in the DeKalb County Jail at this time awaiting bond. It is likely that he will eventually be extradited to Wisconsin, where there is an outstanding order for his arrest for violating his parole by leaving the state without notifying officers of where he was going.
